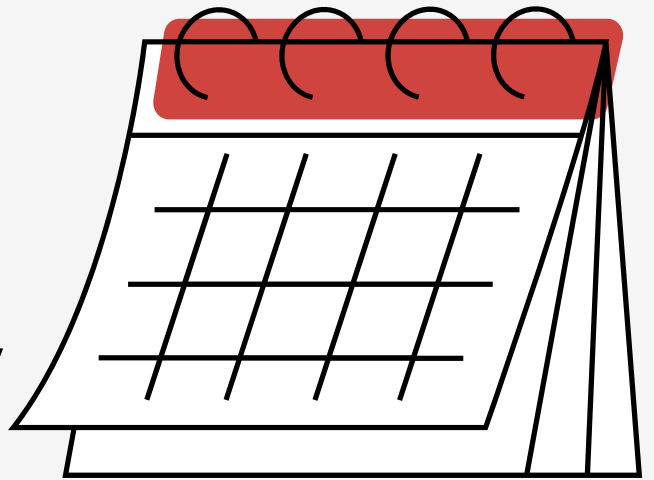

HOW DO YOU CLEAN HIGH RAIN GUTTERS?

The following are a few innovative ideas you can implement to clean your property's gutters without a ladder:

1. Use a Gutter Cleaning Wand Hose Attachment
2. Use a Leaf Blower Gutter Cleaning Kit

Cleaning high rain gutters is a vital aspect of home maintenance that should not be overlooked. By following these tips and techniques, you can ensure that your gutter system remains clear and functional, protecting your home from water damage and preserving its structural integrity

PREVENT WATER DAMAGE TO YOUR HOME



We recommend cleaning your gutters twice a year to avoid the risks of water damage. Water damage from gutters that haven't been maintained can occur both inside and outside of the home.

Excess water can travel into your home through crevices and cracks in the siding. This trickle might not seem like such a big deal at first but the compounding effects can result in serious and extensive water damage. This will appear as ugly staining to your walls and ceiling.

Clogged gutters and downspouts can also push water, with nowhere else to go, through the roofing structure. This process is aided by another problem that occurs when your gutters haven't been maintained—ice dams.

LUCKY CHARMS™ CAKE

Ingredients

- box Betty Crocker™ Super Moist™ White Cake Mix
- Water, oil and eggs called for on cake mix box
- 1/8teaspoon green gel food color, or to desired shade of green
- 1family size box (20.5 oz) Lucky Charms™ cereal
- 2tubs (16 oz) Betty Crocker™ Rich & Creamy Vanilla Frosting



Directions

- Heat oven to 350° F. Spray 2 (8-inch) round cake pans with cooking spray; line bottoms with cooking parchment paper circles.
- Make cake batter as directed on box. Stir in food color. Divide batter between pans. Bake about 30 minutes or until tops spring back when touched in center and toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pans on cooling rack 10 minutes before turning out and cooling completely.
- Meanwhile, remove marshmallows from cereal box to bowl, and set aside.
- Trim off rounded cake tops. Place one layer on cake plate; drop a few tablespoons frosting on center of cake.
- Spread frosting evenly over cake; top with second layer. Drop about 1/3 cup frosting onto top cake layer, and spread over top and down sides in thin layer to create a “crumb coat—it’s totally fine if you get crumbs in this frosting layer; this acts to seal in the stray crumbs before a final frosting.
- Refrigerate crumb-coated cake 1 hour. Pile remaining frosting on top of cake, and spread evenly over top and sides, making as smooth of a frosted surface as possible. Decorate cake with marshmallows by placing them in neat rows around outside of cake. To decorate top of cake, start with a single marshmallow in center, and encircle it with rings of marshmallows until cake is completely covered in marshmallows.
